REPART STOP


The children took part in a sponsored circuit training session with Mr Smith and raised a fantastic amount of £1452.00. Thank you for all your support.

<u>Holidays and absence during</u> <u>term time</u>

We are still experiencing a significant number of requests for children to be away from school during Term time and whilst we are aware that there will always be a small number of exceptional circumstances, requests for time away from school <u>MUST</u> be kept to a minimum. Attendance is regularly monitored and we work closely with the Educational Social Welfare Officer to review any absence that falls below 95%.
