# School Procedures for Leave of Absence Requests

We discourage parents from withdrawing their children from school during term time. Amendments to the Education (Pupil Registration) (England) Regulation 2006 removed references to family holiday and extended leave. The amendments make clear that headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

If leave of absence is required due to possible exceptional circumstances parents must complete an "Application for Leave During Term Time" form and make an appointment to discuss the specific circumstances with Phase Leaders or Deputy Headteacher

The form must be returned to school <u>at least 2 weeks in advance of the proposed leave and before committing to any expense</u>. School will inform parents in writing of the decision for authorised/unauthorised within 2 weeks of receiving the application.

Parents who withdraw their child/children for unauthorised holidays in term time may be issued with an Education Fixed Penalty Notice.

### Morning Arrangements


Arriving at school in plenty of time is very important for children to have a positive start to the day.
