Aims 2016-2017

Poulton Lancelyn Primary School endeavour to provide all children with opportunities to lead a healthy and active lifestyle. We provide high quality Physical Education lessons, a large variety of extra-curricular clubs and Active Play sessions are part of our lunch time provision. Our aim is to ensure that all pupils enjoy physical activity at their own personal level, whether this is socially with friends at lunch time or through competitive competition against other schools. In order to accomplish this, we have allocated our PE budget towards purchasing professional support, equipment and resources.

Measuring the impact of the PE & School Sport Grant 2016-2017

We continue to establish links with Bebington High Sports College. This includes:

- 2 Hours/ week curriculum teaching time taught by a specialist PE teacher
- Lesson observations at the beginning and end of each half term by the PE specialist to set
 CPD targets and measure impact of CPD with staff
- Extra-curricular club (this is changed every half-term) aimed at children from Year 3 to Year 6 and provided by a sports coach through Bebington High (club spaces remain over-subscribed throughout the year and often have a waiting list)
- Professional Development plan for teachers
- Access to Intra-school competitions (school vs. school) organised by the Bebington High competitions group eg. Indoor Athletics, Quad Kids, Gymnastics, Netball, Basketball, Football, Hockey, etc.
- Planning and Assessment documentation to ensure full curriculum coverage and assessment for all children in Years 1-6
- Specialist support in achieving the Sainsbury's Active Schools Mark: documentation, completion of application: Silver Mark
- Access to Bebington High CPD courses each half term for staff to attend- mainly occurs in a specialist setting
- Transport to sporting competitions at a reduced rate via the Bebington High mini bus Other areas for funding impact:
 - Updating sports equipment, purchasing new equipment as needed
 - Sports equipment safety check
 - Further sporting activities and/ or competitions organised by other groups beyond Bebington High School: Wirral Cross Country League- annual membership, Bebington Schools Swimming Gala, Corgi and Houlihan Cup Football leagues, Netball tournaments
 - Other clubs run by staff within school but have not lead to intra-school competitions: TAG rugby
