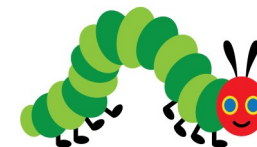
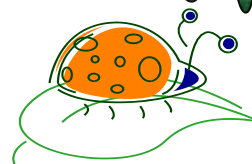

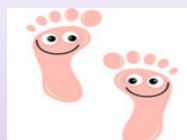

**Learning Letter and
Extended Home Learning Challenges**

Summer 1 2019



Literacy

We will be exploring the features of fiction and non-fiction texts and using books to find out different facts about plants and animals. We will then use what we have found out about plants and animals to make information booklets. We will look at books in detail, including 'Aaaarrghh Spider!' by Lydia Monks, 'What the ladybird heard' by Julia Donaldson, 'Yucky worms' by Viven French 'The very hungry caterpillar' by Eric Carle. We will also be writing stories about different characters, using mini beasts as a focus.

Challenge! Can you make an information booklet about your favourite mini beast?

Phonics

We will be continuing to read and write linked to our RWI phonics programme. The children will continue to read their books in the lesson and at home. They will continue with set 1 sounds and start to learn the set 2 sounds. The children will start to increase their reading of new red words that can't be phonetically sounded out. They are also using their Fred fingers to spell out the words as they write. The children will continue to hold a sentence in their heads and write it down.

Maths

We will explore doubling and halving using objects and develop our ability to work out problems in our heads. We will continue to develop our skills in addition and subtraction and writing out number sentences, using number lines and counters to help us to work them out. We will learn our number bonds to ten as well as exploring different ways of making numbers from 1-20 and beyond. With adult support, we will develop our ability to solve problems including word problems and money problems and will use what we have learned to create our own problems for our friends. During continuous provision, we will continue to make 2D shape patterns and explore the names and properties of 2D and 3D shapes.

Challenge! Can you learn your number bonds to 10? Can you double and half a number?

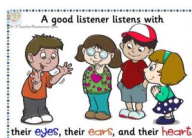


Communication & Language

We will continue to talk about how we ask and answer questions and we will use these skills in all areas of our learning. In talk time, we will develop our ability to form an opinion and to speak clearly about what we think and how we feel. We will be working with different talking partners and in groups to develop our speaking and listening skills.



Challenge- can talk about your favourite book and give reasons why it is your favourite?



Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will be looking at what makes a good friend and how we can be a good friend to others. We will be looking at resolving conflicts and how to have kind hands. We will be learning to work together and we will talk about sharing.

JIGSAW— Relationships

Understanding the World

We will be looking at the life cycles of various animals and observing this in the classroom. We will be looking at what makes plants grow and exploring what happens when plants are grown in different places. In our outdoor area we will go on mini beast hunts to find out about the animals that live there and observe and make comparisons between them. We will be exploring different programs on the iPads and look at how we can use different media to capture experiences.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will continue to make 3D models linked to our own interests as well as 3D models of bugs and mini beasts. We will explore the author and illustrator 'Eric Carle' through our focus book 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and we will paint in the style of the illustrator. Through exploring different manmade and natural materials, we will combine the different textures to make collages of different outdoor scenes. In music, we will continue to find the pulse in different songs and continue to build up our repertoire of songs that we have learnt.

Physical Development

We will continue to learn different ball skills and develop our coordination and control using different equipment. We will be performing different exercises and observing how our body changes. We will continue to focus on our letter and number formation as well as size and presentation.
