


Key Vocabulary

Precious	'precious' means of great value; not to be wasted or treated carelessly	Judaism	The monotheistic religion of the Jewish people.
Christianity	The religion based on the person and teachings of Jesus Christ, or its beliefs and practices.	Islam	The religion of the Muslims, a monotheistic faith regarded as revealed through Muhammad as the Prophet of Allah.
Buddhism	A widespread Asian religion or philosophy, founded by Siddhartha Gautama in north-eastern India in the 5th century BC.	John the Baptist	According to Jesus Christ, John the Baptist stands as the greatest prophet in the Bible (Matthew 11:11; Luke 7:28). John's responsibility was to prepare people for the coming of the Messiah. John was a preacher, a priest and a prophet.
Hinduism	Hinduism is an Indian religion. It is the world's third-largest religion.	Paul	Paul was Jewish and initially persecuted the followers of Jesus. He had an experience with Jesus and converted. He established the church.
Sikhism	Sikhism, also known as Sikhi, is an Indian religion, and is a philosophy, that originated in the Punjab region of the Indian subcontinent, around the end of the 15th century CE. Precious means of great value; not to be wasted or treated carelessly. Items that have a high monetary value are not always precious to us. Valuable means something is worth a great deal of money. Valuable is a thing of great worth, especially a small item of personal property. Belongings are things that a person owns or has with them.



Sacred means connected with God or a god or dedicated to a religious purpose and so deserving great respect. **Christian** sacred things – bible, church, Easter, Christmas, Jerusalem, Bethlehem, Jesus, God. **Buddhism** sacred things – Tripitaka, Stupa, Wesak festival, India, Buddha. **Sikhism** sacred things – Guru Nank, Guru Granth Sahib, Diwali, Hola Mohalla festival, Gurdwara. **Judaism** sacred things - Synagogue, Torah, Jerusalem, Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur. **Islam** sacred things- Sunnah, Mosque, Makkah, Allah, Muhammad. **Hinduism** sacred things – Vedas, Mandir, Divali, River Ganges, India, Aum
