



Learning Letter and Extended Home Learning Challenges

Summer 2 2018

Literacy

We will be looking at stories linked to pirates, including 'Captain Wag the pirate dog' by Michael Terry, The Troll by Julia Donaldson and Peter Pan! And we will look at how the stories are structured to help us to write our own pirate stories, that have a beginning, middle and end. We will write 'messages in bottles' to our pirate friends, write letters to the pirates and create wanted posters.

Challenge! Can you retell your own pirate story before you write it down? How would you start your story?

Read Write Inc

The children are continuing to practise Set 1 sounds and learn the set 2 sounds. They will be exploring more of the ditty books and applying their phonics sounds through Fred Talk. They are continuing to practise their handwriting and letter formation using the Read Write Inc rhymes.

The children apply all their phonics through their writing and reading throughout the day.

Maths

Challenge! Can you count to 30 and back? Can you count to 100 in steps of 1 or 10? Can you count in steps of 2 or 5?

Communication & Language

We will continue to learn to be a good listener and a good speaker and will work with our talking partners to help us to do this. We will talk about how we ask and answer questions and we will use these skills in all areas of our learning. We will continue to listen and respond to stories and rhymes and look at characters in more detail by interviewing them

and role- playing what they might say and do

Challenge- Can you act out a story and perform it to your family?





Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will look at how we can help our family and friends and we will explore looking at different situations from different viewpoints in philosophy. We will look at our hobbies and our likes and dislikes and talk about people's interests and how we differ from one another.



Understanding the World

We will be using globes and maps to explore where pirates came from and using our creative skills to make our own maps. We will use our senses to explore different objects and investigate their properties. Through ICT using the iPads we will look at photographs and we will take our own photographs of nature in the outdoor area. Challenge! What do you know about pirates? Can you name a famous pirate?

This term we start a transition programme preparing the children for Year 1.

The children will be going in to the Year 1 classes for story time.

They are starting to intergrate at playtimes with Year 1 and 2 in readiness for Year1.

The children will start to enter the playground using the drop off system in the mornings.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will prepare for our 'pirate day' by practicing songs and dances linked to pirates. We will explore the sounds of different instruments and we will compose music based around the waves at sea. In the outdoor area, we will sketch flowers and animals and we will collect leaves to explore leaf rubbing using different materials. We will continue to create models in the creative area, including pirate ships, maps and telescopes.

Physical Development

We will talk about why it is important to lead a healthy lifestyle and what this means, talking about healthy foods and the importance of exercise and keeping clean. We will also talk about why it is important to warm up and cool down before and after exercise. Through outdoor activities we will develop our throwing and catching skills, working with a partner. We will explore moving rhythmically to pirate music and copy and create our own pirate dances.
