



English:

In **English** lessons children will be looking at newspapers and non-fiction writing to present information about the war. The children will develop their understanding of spelling patterns and grammar. The children will be reading Good Night Mister Tom. Literacy sessions will be based upon this book and the children will make a comparison between the book and the film at the end of the topic. **Challenge**

Phonics / Spelling

The children will develop their understanding of spelling patterns and conventions:

Homophones with long I

Homophones (general misconceptions)

And investigating the exception words for Years 3 and 4.

Challenge: Can you find words with these spelling patterns in the books you are reading at home?

In Maths children will be solving single and multi-step problems in all four oper-

ations. They will continue to work on calculations in all four operations and place value, including with decimals. They will recognise and find negative numbers as well as using palce value to round numbers including decimal. They will consider measures, including the conversion of measure and measure problems.
