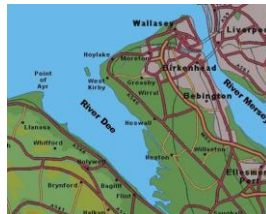

Human features	Things like houses, roads and bridges. They have been built by people.
Physical features	like seas, mountains and rivers are natural. They would be here even if there were no people around.

What?

1. We live in **Spital** which is on the **Wirral**. **Liverpool** is our nearest **city**. There are a range of **human** and **physical** features in our local area.



5. Liverpool and Spital **share** some of the same **features** because they are nearby.

Liverpool also has different features to Spital because it is a city.

A **city** is **larger than a town** or village. It contains more shops and museums.

More people live in Liverpool – it has a **greater population** than Spital.



2/3. A **map** can be used to locate your way around the local area.

There are **human features** in Spital e.g. Shops, houses, church.

There are **physical features** in Spital e.g. field, river.



FIELDWORK LESSON

4. Spital is a **village**. Liverpool is a **city**. Wirral is a **peninsula** – three sides of water. We are close to the **River Mersey** and the **River Dee** - they flow into the **Irish Sea**.

Liverpool is a city. There are lots of **human features** there e.g. theatres, shops, roads, museums, cathedrals and docks. You can also find **physical features** there too such as a river, a beach (further out of Liverpool city centre).
