Collection of warm winter clothing, coats, fleeces, hats, gloves, scarves etc to be sent to Syrian refugees living in the Lebanon.




We have been supporting the Wirral's new initiative to keep our streets clean. **Green Flag Renewel** We are currently working towards our second renewel


