Writing

<u>Story</u>

Geography (priority)

Trade Triangle

During the Victorian period, Britain massively increased its trade around the world. One significant trading strategy was called the trade triangle. On each journey of the triangle, boats went to different parts of the world for a specific reason.

Can you research:

Where the boats went? Why they went there? Think about and discuss how people would have felt because of this trade triangle? Start with the boats leaving Britain. There is a sheet attached.

<u>Victorian Liverpool</u>

As part of geography, we need to examine how humans have developed places and why this has happened. Liverpool was one place that dramatically developed in the Victorian era, but why? First of all, we would like you to research Victorian Liverpool and write down facts that you find. Then, look at the population chart that we have given you. There are specific points on the chart that we would like you to look at to examine why Liverpool's population changed. See if you can find out.

Port Sunlight

Why is Port Sunlight different to the rest of Wirral? Why did people decide to settle in Port sunlight? Can you research Port Sunlight's history to examine why humans decided to settle in the village? Create an information report about the village.

History

Industrial Revolution

You know a little bit about the industrial revolution through our environment topic but what else can you find out? What were the benefits of the revolution? Were there any disadvantages? Did it affect our local area at all? What was it like for lower class people? Complete some computer research and present this through an information guide.

In our final term, we will be examining humans and plants. All living things do 7 processes, which are often named MRS NERG (or MRS GREN). Can you create a poster which highlights these 7 processes?
