Writing

In writing sessions this week, we are beginning to create a magazine article promoting black heroes of the past and present day. We have been learning a lot about different inspirational black people such as Marcus Rashford, Matthew Henson and Rosa Parks. The magazine article should include key information (in text boxes) about racial inequality as well as specific examples. As well as structure features, it is important that we use key grammatical features in our piece including:

Paragraphs	Expanded noun phrases	Range of punctuation	Compound and complex sentences
Relative clauses	Spelling strategies	Vocabulary choices	Effective proofreading

You will also need images, captions and extra facts.

Grammar

In grammar, we are working on using relative clauses in our writing. Relative clauses are included within sentences directly after a noun and give more information about that noun. They always start with a relative pronoun and use punctuation such as commas, brackets and dashes. They can also come at the end of sentences.
