
Word reading






Easter Themed Basket Craft

Home Science Activities

<u>Grow a Carrot Top</u>

Challenge: - Grow something using tea time leftovers!

<u>You will need:</u>

- Carrot top (needs to have some root growth remaining on the top)
- Shallow dish or saucer
- Cotton wool balls

What to do:

This one's really simple.

All you need to do is add a layer of cotton wool balls to the dish and place the carrot top on top. Add enough water to the cotton balls so that they are damp but not flooded with water, then place your dish in a sunny spot like a windowsill. Make sure to check that your cotton balls stay damp throughout your growing period.

It will take a little while to get going, but once your carrot top starts it will grow quite quickly.

If you catch the veggie-growing bug, leeks, spring onions and garlic can all be easily regrown from leftovers.

<u>Super-Secret Messages!</u>

Create a secret message for a superhero!

<u>You will need:</u>

- One half of a lemon (make sure a grown up helps you to cut it!)
- Half a teaspoon of water
- Small bowl
- Spoon
- White paper
- Cotton buds
- A lamp with a lightbulb that gives off lots of heat, or another heat source, such as a radiator

What to do:

- 1. Squeeze all the juice out of your lemon into the bowl and mix in the water with a spoon
- 2. Think of a secret message for a superhero you could write your name, a sentence, or do a picture
- 3. Soak the end of a cotton bud in your mixture then use it to write your secret message on a piece of paper
- 4. Wait a few minutes for the paper to dry. While you're waiting you could turn on your lamp to give it time to heat up.
- 5. When the paper is dry, get a grown up to help you hold it near to the bulb (be careful, it'll be hot!) for a few minutes, but don't let it get so hot it burns. Your secret message will appear!





Help Supertato!



The Evil Pea is up to mischief again! He keeps freezing Supertato's friends! Can you do some research to help Supertato find the quickest way to melt ice?

First you'll need to freeze some water in an ice cube tray or an ice bag.

Then when they have all frozen, break out the ice cubes and test out different ways of making them melt.
