

Times of Day

8:45 – Gates Open – children enter classrooms

9:00 – Registration

After this time all children should enter via the Main Entrance and report to School Office.

3:30 – End of school day (TBC)

Parents will be informed of pick up times as soon as these can be confirmed linked to Covid guidance.

All absences must be reported to school office. If children are being picked up by someone else then please inform staff on the school gate or contact the school office.



Routine Changes Year 3

- Children will enter the building through the Y3/4 door (opposite the Y2 door) in the junior building.
 - Children will leave school out of the Year 5/6 door. Parents can collect their children by meeting them on the junior driveway.
- Playtimes will change to 10:20 and will be with Year 4 on the junior playground.

End of day arrangements

Please ensure your child is closely supervised whilst still on school premises. We ask that playground equipment is not used at the end of the school day.

We understand that some parents may wish to give Key Stage 2 children permission to walk across to the infant building to meet their designated adult at the end of the day.

A letter has been sent home to clarify the end of day arrangements for your child/ren. Please confirm the collection arrangements for your child September to avoid any confusion.

Medical Information

All medicines including inhalers should be taken to the School Office by you/an adult, and not be given directly to the child. Paperwork needs to be completed by parents for any medication including inhalers to be administered in school. (The Office staff will pass inhalers to the class teachers which will be kept in the classroom). Please inform the office if any details change including phone numbers and addresses throughout the year.

Uniform reminders

Uniform

We expect all children to wear school uniform. Jewellery including earrings must not be worn apart from a wrist watch. Black school shoes must be worn and **not** trainers.

Long hair must be tied up with a plain bobble/hair ties/slides in school colours purple, black, white or grey. Large bows will be discouraged.

PE – **school tracksuits** may be worn all day on PE days. If you choose not to purchase a Poulton Lancelyn tracksuit, children should attend school in their uniform and get changed into their PE kit prior to the lesson. Please ensure all items of uniform are labelled including coats, shoes and PE pumps, book bags etc.

A Lost Property Box is in the school entrance.





Healthy Snack

Water Bottles:-

Please make sure that your child has a labelled water bottle. This can be filled up in school during the day. **No juice.** We encourage your child to bring home their water bottles each night so they can be washed.

Snacks

KS1: Fruit will be provided for children during the morning break. Children may bring their own healthy snack.

KS2: All children can bring in a snack from home if they wish to using our updated list of acceptable snacks such as carrot sticks or raisins.

We do not allow sweets and fizzy drinks as we are encouraging healthy eating within school. As we have several children with nut allergies in school, we do not allow nutbased snacks. This includes peanut butter and Nutella.

Milk

Milk is available to purchase for children and must be ordered on-line with the milk company - https://www.schoolmilkuk.com Details are available from the school office or via the school website.

Behaviour

We promote a positive behaviour system that reinforces and rewards good behaviour. Our school charter has been agreed by staff, children and Governors to ensure a positive learning environment. The children are taught about their rights and their responsibilities to ensure the school rules are being promoted and followed.

HOUSE TEAMS

All children are placed into one of four houses when they join school. Children earn house points throughout the week and they are then collated and announced in the weekly Celebration Assembly. The winning house receives a trophy for the display. The house with the most trophies at the end of the half term are rewarded with a non-uniform day.

Purple Passes — Each class can earn purple passes each week.

These are awarded for whole class behaviour. Classes achieving 20 or more at the end of the week will be congratulated in the weekly Celebration Assembly and be awarded an extra15 min playtime the following week.

Purple Certificates — Class teachers award certificates in the weekly Celebration Assembly

Cup of Kindness — This is presented in our Celebration Assembly to any child who has demonstrated a particular act of kindness nominated by staff and children.

School nurse Medical and SEN concerns

Miss Haworth is the school Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator.

'Growth Mindset'

Your mindset is a mental attitude that determines how you will interpret and respond to situations. It's a set of beliefs or a way of thinking that determines certain behaviours such as how you think, what you feel, and what you do.

There are two types of mindset 'Fixed' and 'Growth'.





Fixed Mindset:- Intelligence is fixed, avoid or fear challenges, give up when things are tough, make excuses, don't try so you won't fail, refuse to learn from mistakes.

Growth Mindset:- Intelligence can be developed, embrace challenge without fear, keep trying in the tough times, remember success takes work, learn from mistakes, listen to feedback and learn from mistakes.

At Poulton Lancelyn we are developing our teaching and learning around growth mindsets to promote:-

- a love for learning and self-improvement
 - a desire to be challenged
- a willingness to work for positive results
- a belief that you can control the outcomes in your life with effort and practice

Please ensure children have their full PE kit in school or wear the school tracksuit. Jewellery must not be worn for P.E.

Educational Visits and Visitors

We try to organise school trips and invite visitors to school to enhance the teaching of the curriculum and inspire children's learning. The school may request voluntary contributions towards the cost of such activities. We will plan trips in accordance with COVID-19 guidance.

Home Learning

Reading

In Year 3, we work towards children being independent, fluent readers. In the Autumn term, all children will have scheme books sent home every Friday but records should be brought into school daily incase we read with the children. We ask that adults listen to their child reading aloud at least twice weekly and this should be evidenced in the reading record.

In the Autumn Term, children will take part in Book Club and we will read a book as a class. This book will then count as one stamp towards our Starbooks scheme. In the Spring Term, children will independently choose a Starbooks book. Once the children read 5 books (which equates to 5 stamps), they will receive a sweet treat from the canteen and when they receive 10 stamps, the children will be invited to the Starbooks café to enjoy a hot chocolate.





Home Learning

Maths and English homework will be set via 'Seesaw' on a Monday and should be completed before the following Sunday.

<u>Spelling</u>

Children will be taught spelling patterns and age appropriate common exception words in school. Spelling lists are available on class information pages on the website and our Seesaw learning platform. These spellings are to practise at home to consolidate the spellings learnt in school each week. Spellings can be practised weekly on 'Spelling Frame' – indicated on spelling overview

<u>Maths</u>

We will continue to develop skills across all aspects of mathematics, including counting and understanding number, knowing and using number facts, calculating, understanding shape, measuring and handling data. Children will be set 'Mathletics' homework related to the maths they have been learning in school or an alternative task via Seesaw.

Communication

- Parent Whatsapp groups/Facebook groups – as a school we recognise that these are an important social networking system and help parents and children to develop positive relationships and build a sense of community. However, at times, school information is misrepresented, which has caused upset and confusion in the past.

Parents are strongly encouraged to communicate directly with school if they have queries or concerns.
