## E-safety: Rings of responsibility

We know the difference between right and wrong in real life and need to use the same thinking when online. When we do, say, see or play things online what is our **responsibility**? The ring of responsibility is a guide to help understand this.

### Vocabulary

<b>Responsibility</b>	Personal duty to deal with a situation.	<b>retouching</b>	Part of a web address that shows who it belongs to.
<b>cropped</b>	Cut out or removed like using scissors digitally.	<b>foreground</b>	What is in the front of the image.
<b>composition</b>	The way something is put together or arranged.	<b>publication</b>	Document made from images and text like an advert or magazine page.

In a photo editing programme, photos can be **cropped** to remove parts of the image you don't need or to create an effect.

Images can be changed in several ways. The **composition** of a image can change its look or mood as well as believability or effectiveness. Undoing and saving work is important too.

Changing the colours and filters on a photo change its' mood and effect in positive or negative ways. **Retouching** tools help to improve an image too.

Retouching can turn real images into fake ones. When planning a composite image, think about what's in the **foreground** as well as what's in the background.

When planning and creating a **publication**, using the filters, tools, borders and retouching techniques learnt is very important.
