4. Miss Marsden was sorting out the buses for the trip to Chester. There are 64 children who need to arrive in Chester. Two buses are sent to take them there. How many children should go on each bus? Miss Marsden used the bus stop method to work out the answer and said there should be 32 on each bus. What do you think?
5. Mrs Swift is using her grid method again. There are 16 fireworks in a box. Sam has 7 boxes. Mrs Swift said that Sam has got 83 fireworks altogether. What do you think?
