The present progressive tense uses 'is' or 'are' followed by a present tense verb:

Easter

This half term, we are looking at the Easter story in Christianity as well as symbolism in Christianity. The Cross is a pertinent symbol of Christianity due to its links with the Easter story. We would like you to create a cross from card and use tissue paper as well as other materials to collage it. Once dried, add key events from the Easter story onto your Cross.

Throughout our PE curriculum this year, we have been learning about keeping our bodies healthy. Make sure that you are keeping active (indoors if necessary). You could create workout routines to music as an example of a simple yet effective activity.

Civic Award

Completion

For anyone participating in Civic award, we have completed the service to others section (First Aid) together in school. For the local awareness section, you need to complete an independent research project about our local area. We would advise researching the history of Birkenhead Park and comparing it to New York's Central Park, which was inspired by our local park. This project will need to be brought into school. Make sure that you have completed the other sections so that your books can be fully completed when we return to school.

Science

Life Cycles

This half term, we have been looking at life cycles of different plants and animals. The final life cycle we will be looking at is to do with the process of metamorphosis. Metamorphosis means the changing of an animal's structure via transformation. There are two types of metamorphosis: complete and incomplete. we would like you to research the two types of metamorphosis. Here are some types of animals which go through each type.

Complete metamorphosis	Incomplete metamorphosis
Frogs	Dragonflies
Butterflies	Grasshoppers

After researching the stages of both types of metamorphosis, we would like you to write a diary entry in role as an animal which has gone through complete metamorphosis. We have written an example diary entry of a dragonfly who has gone through incomplete metamorphosis. As well as features for Year 5 writing, it is important to include scientific vocabulary in your diary entry.

Philosophy

Family conversations

Each night, we will add a question to the school website for you to discuss with your family. It is a chance to develop your communication skills and listen to other points of view.

Geography

<u>Spain</u>

In geography lessons, we have been looking at countries involved in the Spanish empire during the Tudor period. We would like you to compare our country to Spain by focusing in on Barcelona (in Spain) and Liverpool (in England). Research both cities and identify key human and physical geographical features. Features could include the following:

Physical geographical features	Human geographical features

Once researched, we would like you to create a comparative report about the two cities, focusing on geographical elements. Your report should include pictures, photographs or drawings as well. Perhaps you could include a map of each city.
