This term the children have enjoyed reading and listening to many different story books from Owl Babies, Elmer, The Rainbow Fish, The Jolly Christmas Postman, and many more.

We have read the story book Handa's Surprise in Literacy. This gave us an opportunity to look at different fruits from the story. All the children had an opportunity to taste some of the fruits in the story including some we may not have tried before. We tried banana, Kiwi, Mango, Pineapple, Sharon Fruit, Papaya and Avocado Pear. The staff were very impressed by the children who enjoyed trying the new fruits. Some even asked for more!

We worked with a visiting artist to create two pieces of welt felt Elmer and Rainbow Fish pictures. All the children participated and worked collaboratively to embed our MAT CARE values. The children learnt new skills to make the felt out of Merino wool.





This term the children have been learning their phonics through our new programme RWI and it is wonderful to see the children starting to apply these sounds into their reading and writing. They are enjoying meeting the Oxford Reading Tree characters, learning their names and sharing their adventures through the other books they bring home. We want children to enjoy reading for pleasure by reading and listening to stories being read to them through a wide variety of books at home and in school.

The children have spent time with their Year 6 'big friends' this term. They had time on the playground playing together and performed their carol concert for them. The children are having a morning with their big friends on Friday 21st December.

The children talked about their bodies and explored the 5 senses in science. The children also made predictions and observed what happens to chocolate when heated. They have had opportunities to make simple predictions before investigating what happens to chocolate when left on their hands.

The children have been on an Autumnal walk around school to collect Autumnal objects e.g. conkers, acorns and leaves. The children talked about the changes in leaves and the signs of Autumn and other seasons.



We are very proud of the children who are becoming more independent with their dressing and undressing for PE. They are getting better with fastening buttons and zips. Well Done for practising at home.

In PE the children have practised skipping, jumping, hopping and balancing skills though different activities and games. We have learnt how to keep safe and use the space around us carefully. They have learnt to work together and the importance of exercise on their bodies and what happens to their heart.

We are also learning how to hold a pencil and use scissors correctly. Can you practise at home cutting different shapes and gluing them to make pictures?






The children have explored different technologies and have learnt how we receive and send messages via an email. The children were very excited to send a class email to their teachers and to receive a response. They have learnt about the different parts of a computer and how to keep safe on computers and on the internet using Smartie the Penguin.
