Dear Parents,

Please find below, information regarding our key worker provision for the final two weeks of term. You may already be aware that the Government have announced that schools will **not be open for children over the summer period.**

Our Service to Key Worker Families

- School is open for key worker children from Monday to Friday, 8.50 to 3.15 (including Friday afternoons).
- As per DfE guidance, we are required to provide childcare provision (watching films, craft and playtimes) however, due to parental requests, time will be allocated for children to complete CPG books/Seesaw activities independently during the day should you wish to provide it.
- Please email helpmemilne@poultonlancelyn.wirral.sch.uk for the specific days that you require between **Monday 6th July and Friday 17th July**. Please note, due to health and safety restrictions if children can remain at home they should do so. We do not have the capacity to admit children who are not on our daily registers.
- Your children should bring a packed lunch either in a named disposable bag or a lunch box (no yoghurts must be included due to food being eaten in carpeted areas). For Year 2 only, due to entitlement to Universal Free School Meals, a packed lunch can be requested from our catering team, Taylor Shaw.
- Children will follow social distancing and hygiene rules: washing hands frequently when entering and exiting their designated room, remaining in their places whenever possible and not sharing resources.
- Your child will remain in the bubble that they are currently in.

In order to ensure social distancing when entering and exiting school, we have placed one-way walking systems around our site, which we need you to follow when bringing and collecting your children. We have also staggered the start and finish times of our groups (as well as break times) so that we do not have large numbers of people on/around our school site at one time. **Arriving punctually and leaving promptly is paramount to the system.**

Other Information

Children are not required to bring any additional equipment with them such as pencil cases as all necessary resources will be provided.

All children should have sun cream applied before they enter school as outdoor learning is encouraged.

Children can bring sun cream with them, however staff will be unable to support them in applying it. Roll-on sun creams are easier for children to apply.

Pupils must wear clean clothes to school each day. Non uniform is encouraged unless school uniform can be laundered each evening. All clothing should be suitable for outdoor learning and daily PE activities.

Children should bring a sun hat and a full water bottle.

A school bag can be brought to store lunch, water bottles and sun cream.
