As geographers we will...

- ... name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries of the UK including capital cities, surrounding seas and physical and human features

- recognise the <u>chronology</u> within their own family tree and the Royal family (1926-present day) ...discuss similarities and differences in how schools have changed in the past 100 years ...look at the significance of Royal events such as recent royal weddings and royal births ...consider the continuity and change of how life at home has changed (central heating, double glazing, bathrooms, washing machines)
- ...research a member of the Royal family and consider their responsibilities and significance to life in Britain (historical enquiry)
- ... look at the causes and consequences of decisions made in Parliament and the Queen's relationship with Parliament
- ...study the causes and consequences of how the Royal family is evolving and the impact on the future of the Royal family
- ...research how entertainment has changed in the past 100 years in Britain
- ... look at the significance of the Lancelyn Green family and the impact that they had on our local area
- ... look at the significance of royal titles e.g. Prince of Wales and Duke of Edinburgh
