Biome

Biomes are areas of the planet with a similar climate and landscape, where similar animals and plants live

An area with distinct plant types, determined by climate, soil, drainage and elevation.

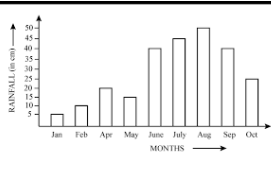
Desert

What?

1. The UK is a **temperate** country. **Rainfall** really means all precipitation—all the water that falls on an area. **Temperature** is a degree of hotness or coldness the can be measured using a thermometer. **Wind** is the movement of air near Earth's surface. **Weather represents the day-to-day levels** of these things and that **climate represents an average for a given area**



5. The **climate** of an area determines the vegetation that will grow there and the animals that will thrive there. There are five different types of **vegetation regions** in the world: **forest, grassland, tundra, desert, and ice sheet**; these regions are determined by the climate of an area. In the Atacama desert most **plants are small with little or no leaves**.



2. **Deserts** are places **that don't get much rain**, and are **very dry**. They can be hot or cold places. **A desert is a large area of land, usually in a hot region, where there is almost no water, rain, trees, or plants**. Most hot deserts are found near the equator. The world's largest desert is found in Antarctica – although it is not hot there, there is very little rainfall



6. Know that a desert is a region with extremely low precipitation they are not always hot **the world's largest desert** is found in **Antarctica** – although it is not hot there, there is very little rainfall

3. The **Atacama** Desert is in Chile. It is one of the **driest** places on Earth. The average annual rainfall is just **1mm** per year. Temperatures can range from around 40 degrees Celsius to -5 degrees in some places. The **UK** is in a **temperate** climate zone, which means that there are four seasons. The winters are cool and wet, and the summers are warm and wet; temperatures usually stay mild with rare extremes. western wind that brings moisture



7. Some areas of desert have significantly developed in the last century. **Oil** has been the key reason for the **development of Dubai**



Dubai is **large tourist area**. The physical features of the desert have influenced human development

4. A **biome** is **a community of plants and/or animals that share characteristics based on the environment in which they live** Biomes are areas of the planet with a similar climate and landscape, where similar animals and plants live. Some of the world's main biomes include **rainforest, desert, savannah, grassland, woodland and tundra**. Animals that live in the Atacama Desert include; llamas, vicunas, alpacas, huemel deer, mice, grey fox and viscacha (the largest member of the chinchilla family).
